## ABOUT HÉLÈNE LOUVART

Hélène Louvart (1964) studied cinematography at the École Louis-Lumière film school in Noisy-le-Grand. Immediately after graduating in 1985, she began working on her first film projects. She has collaborated on more than 100 internationally diverse productions, with both well-known directors and emerging talents. Her body of work includes feature films, television films, short films and documentaries, such as *Les plages d'Agnès* by Agnès Varda (2008). Also significant was her 3D camera work on Wim Wenders' dance film *Pina* (2011). She is best known for her collaboration with Italian director Alice Rohrwacher, with whom she worked on award-winning films such as *Le meraviglie* (2014) and *Lazzaro felice* (2018). Another significant collaboration arose with American director Eliza Hittman. For both of their films *Beach Rats* (2017) and *Never Rarely Sometimes Always* (2020), Hélène Louvart was nominated for the Independent Spirit Award. Notable is her work for Brazilian director Karim Aïnouz's *A Vida Invisível*, which won the Prix Un Certain Regard at the 2019 Cannes Film Festival.
